Winter energy saving **mandate** – **October 2022**

- 350 public bodies required to achieve (schools exempt):
 - 5-10% savings overall, 15% in buildings
- And to:
 - Sign up to Reduce your Use energy efficency campaign
 - Reduce temperature of heating to 19C where possible
 - Shut off heating in office buildings at least 1-2 hours before buildings close
 - Occupy and heat smallest space possible
 - Reduce unnecessary lighting and turn off display lighting between 5 and 7
 - Reduce peak electricity
 - Undertake energy efficiency assessment and plan for energy audit by external expert
 - Undertake O&M audit and introduce processes for operational control and measurement





Evaluation of outcomes

- Currently underway
 - Self reported savings and actions taken, from surveys of senior managers responsible for energy (EPOs)
 - Sample of central government buildings with detailed metering
 - Annual Public Sector Monitoring and Reporting
 - Engagement metrics from the energy awareness campaign
 - Staff surveys relating to energy efficiency behaviour



Some examples of savings achieved

- Department of Energy, Climate and Communications
 - 32% saving over 4 months (Oct to Jan) compared with baseline of 2019
 - Largely driven by reducing gas use in HQ through:
 - Reduction in operating hours;
 - Christmas shutdown; and
 - Ongoing monitoring of Building MS
- Fingal County Council
 - 19% saving in 2022
 - Staff engagement by Energy Team
 - · reduced temperatures, improved controls, reduction of space occupied
 - Out of hours walk throughs in most buildings
 - Operation & Maintenance audit of most buildings
- SEAI
 - 30% reduction from Jan 2023 in head office
 - Changed lighting control settings
 - Reduced temperature and altered 'dead band' settings




Survey of energy performance officers – heating actions

Survey of energy performance officers – space and time optimisation




Challenged the core and extended hours
